Recruitment and appointment of office bearers

All of the association's trustees and office bearers are appointed or reappointed by the members at our annual general meeting.

Governing document

The committee is a charitable unincorporated association and the purposes and administration arrangements are set out in our constitution.

Charitable purposes

Our purpose, as recorded in our constitution, shall be to relieve the poverty, advance the education and promote the welfare of children in need in the countries we visit to watch Scotland's national football team play, in such ways as are charitable in law.

Reserves

As a result of the deficit of £10,576 for the year (2015 - £6,466), the Committee held unrestricted funds of £18,149 at the year-end (2015 - £28,725). The trustees consider that the unrestricted fund of £18,149 will enable the committee to continue to raise and distribute funds for the forthcoming year.

Trustee's remuneration and expenses

The trustees did not receive any remuneration during the year.

Key activities within the year

Steering Group Development

During the period, there were no changes to the members of the Steering Group.

Fundraising Activities

During the period April 2015 – March 2016, the Steering Group continued to develop ideas on merchandise sales, moving to a new standalone online website to reduce selling costs incurred through the eBay shop. In addition, a new range of Polo and Tee shirts launched, as well as other ad hoc merchandise opportunities, with a longtime supporter of the Sunshine Appeal writing a new book for us to sell and raise funds. This is in addition to continuing several revenue streams such as badges and hats from previous years. Due to lack of interest, there was no Kilted Golf Day, although we would look again at holding this in 2016/17.

During the year we also benefitted from one of our supporters running the Paris marathon generating over £3,500 in sponsorship, as well as Tartan Army clubs and supporters continuing to donate proceeds from events, and continue to rely on such fundraising from our supporters.

Independent Examiner's Report For the Year Ended 31 March 2016

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of Tartan Army Sunshine Appeal

I report on the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2016, which are set out on pages 5 to 8.

Respective responsibilities of Trustees and Examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 ("the 2005 Act") and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended) ("the 2006 Regulations"). The charity's trustees consider that the audit requirement of Regulation 10(1)(d) of the 2006 Regulations does not apply. It is my responsibility to examine the accounts as required under section (44)(1)(c) of the 2005 Act and to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of Independent Examiner's Statement

My examination is carried out in accordance with Regulation 11 of the 2006 Regulations. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records.
